HISTORY

Montrose Vikings Basketball Club was formed around 1978 with teams made up of children playing netball and football for Montrose. It was one of the five original clubs associated with the Kilsyth & Mountain District Basketball Association along with SCYC, St Edmonds, The Basin and Maroondah. Kilsyth East joined in shortly afterwards. The girls' competition first played on Friday nights at Croydon Leisure Centre.

The club has a proud history in local Basketball and looks forward to stimulating good sportsmanship for the future. Our aim is to promote healthy and regular competition for all boys and girls in the local area by encouraging them to develop their basketball skills to their full potential.

The Club primarily plays in the Junior Domestic competition run by the Kilsyth and Mountain District Basketball Association.

There are two seasons per year; a Winter Season, which runs in Terms 2 and 3, and a Summer season, which commences in Term 4 and finishes in Term 1 the following year. "Any domestic sporting club only functions because of the daily work of volunteers at every level."

The Summer 2019-2020 season was cut short owing to the COVID-19 pandemic in March 2020. However, Winter 2020 registration and fees had already been collected. During the months of lockdown in Victoria, members were given the opportunity to request a refund from the Club or rollover the funds to the following season. 98% of members requested their registration fees to be rolled over to the next season, whenever it will be allowed to take place.

For the same reason, there have not been any outgoings as games and training have not been able to be conducted, so no hire or game fees have been invoiced for.
